

COUNCIL MINUTES

February 3, 2025

The Archbold Village Council met in regular session on Monday, February 3, 2025, at 5:30 p.m. in Council Chambers with the following members present: Gary Dominique, Vaughn Bentz, Kevin Eicher, Aaron Babcock, Chad Kern, and Karla Ball. Mayor Brad Grime opened the meeting with a moment of silence and presided thereat.

There being no corrections to the minutes of the January 20, 2025 Council meeting, Kevin Eicher moved to approve, seconded by Vaughn Bentz.

Mayor Grime then presented the following items of legislation:

RESOLUTION 2025-04: A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING CHANGE ORDER #1, FINAL FOR EAST LUTZ ROAD – AGRICULTURAL RUNOFF, CONTRACT 4-2024 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
